Established in Maryland in 2009, SAMA gained 501(c)(3) status in 2010. Sustained by donations and grants, we wholeheartedly support education and humanitarian programs through the dedication of volunteers, heartfelt fundraising, and valuable contributions.

To date, the association has donated over \$1,000,000 in medical equipment, education, and infrastructure to communities throughout the Balkans including Serbia, Kosovo & Metohija, Republic of Srpska, and Bosnia & Herzegovina. 2023 was an active year for SAMA. We were able to conduct various fundraising activities, expand our team and – most importantly –

7th Annual SAMA Tennis Open

Our heartfelt gratitude to all attendees of the 2023 SAMA Tennis Open. A special thanks to our athletes whose sportsmanship and skills made for a beautiful day on the courts. We successfully raised more than \$10,000 for the purchase of essential equipment for health centers in Topola and Preševo.

Notably, the Director of the Preševo Health Center emphasized how significant SAMA's contribution would be as the first non-governmental "Serbian" donation to the predominantly "Albanian-populated" town in Southern Serbia. We are in contact with the Health Center in Preševo, and we hope to complete our project there before the end of the year.



6th Annual Chicago Fundraiser

Štrpce

Strpce is the largest Serbian enclave south of the Ibar River in Kosovo. This municipality includes about 10,000 inhabitants, mostly ethnic Serbs. The only nursing school in this part of Kosovo & Metohija is of vital importance for the Serbian community as it prepares pupils for a career in health care.

Guča

The Guča hospital facility, which is almost a century old, had deteriorated significantly, facing a range of issues, including crumbling walls, collapsing ceilings, a damaged roof, and dilapidated carpentry. Additionally, the beds and mattresses were in deplorable conditions. Consequently, patients from Guča had to travel 40km to Čačak General Hospital for treatment.

With local funding, the building underwent a comprehensive reconstruction. However, the budgeting did not account for furniture, rendering the reconstructed hospital nonfunctional. During our visit, we discovered that the facility was entirely devoid of a single hospital bed and hospital furniture.

SAMA donated 20 modern beds, mattresses, hospital furniture, and infusion stands, promptly rendering the facility operational.

Due to safety concerns and travel restrictions, students from Štrpce nursing school are unable to attend any hospital in other parts of Kosovo for practical training, so local teachers attempt to teach practical clinical skills using anatomy models.

Despite all these difficulties, Štrpce's nursing students are very motivated and often compete equally with peers from universities in Serbia. To the joy of the students and teachers, SAMA delivered an entire set of various anatomical models for educational purposes.

Novi Bečej

We were able to donate a valuable, new, and top-of-the-line defibrillator to the health clinic in Novi Bečej. A defibrillator is a device that applies an electric charge or current to

the heart to restore a normal heartbeat.

If the heart rhythm stops due to cardiac arrest, also known as sudden cardiac arrest (SCA), a defibrillator may help it start beating again.

Topola

With support from the local municipality, the health center channeled all available funds into facility renovations, leaving them in a precarious situation, where they lacked essential medical equipment. SAMA recognized the critical importance of this Healthcare Center to the community and committed to addressing their pressing needs.

Ada, a municipality of ethnic Hungarians, like other health centers in Serbia, suffers from underfunding.

Ms. Snežana Strahinjić, the health center head nurse originally contacted SAMA regarding the need for a defibrillator at this center. Specifically, the few defibrillators in operation were either in need of repair or were constantly being utilized away from the health center when taken on urgent calls, in the ambulance, etc. Consequently, physicians would often find themselves unable to help patients presenting with life-threatening acute chest symptoms.

Our donation of a defibrillator was timely and valuable. The donated unit is a top-of-the-line system offering a monitor, which is extremely valuable for accurate diagnostic and monitoring treatment.

The Public Health Institute of Serbia, in Belgrade, oversees 24 regional branches, including one in Šabac.

Its multifaceted role encompasses disease surveillance and prevention. Director Mr. Branko Vujković notified us of operational challenges, especially in the central biochemical laboratory facing disruptions from local electric grid instability.

In November 2023, SAMA stepped in, donating a UPS system. This swift action significantly enhanced the availability and reliability of biochemical analysis, mitigating data loss and testing issues.

Summary and note from our Vice President

In 2023, SAMA continued to focus on primary healthcare in Serbia because we see this as the most crucial segment of healthcare. Unfortunately, in Serbia, much like in the rest of the Balkans, primary care has been severly neglected since the 80s.

Wherever you go, you can see the consequences of such policy: leaking roofs, toilets in horrible shape, original doors and windows that are more than 40 years old.

Often, these health centers have trouble funding the purchase of basic materials needed for operations, not to mention replacing minor equipment such as ECGs or defibrillators. They are pushed toward digitalization (e.g., electronic record usage), but in the majority of centers we visited, computers haven't been upgraded in 10 years or more. On the bright side, when we visit these health centers, we often find enthusiatic people willing to work hard and provide the best possible care for patients. They know what needs to be done and simply need support. Even small donations make a big difference for these health centers.

Thank you all for your support of SAMA. Together, we are making a difference.
